On **5 September 2023 at 14:00 – 15:30 CEST**, Education International (EI) will be holding the first of two webinars in the framework of the <u>"Teacher-led Learning Circles for Formative Assessment"</u> <u>project</u>.

The project aims to provide teachers with tools and support to identify and establish effective teacher-led formative assessment practices that can be disseminated within and across education unions from 2022 to 2024. It is implemented in partnership with member organisations in 7 countries (CNTE/Brazil, FUMTEP/Uruguay, GNAT/Ghana, NUTP/Malaysia, LCH/Switzerland, KTU/South Korea and SNEPPCI/Côte d'Ivoire) with support from Jacobs Foundation.

The first webinar entitled "Formative Assessment Practices in Classrooms Around the World: What works and what doesn't?", will take place on Tuesday 5 September 2023 from 14:00 – 15:30 CEST.

The webinar is an opportunity for project partners to share their experience and findings in their respective countries about the formative assessment; outline how the learning circles have given teachers the autonomy and ability to reflect on the use of formative assessments in their practice, and explain the importance of continuing to support teacher leadership by working alongside governments and school leadership to provide adequate time, funding and expert resourcing for effective professional development.

The webinar will take place in English with simultaneous interpretation in French and Spanish.
